I often am frustrated when I need to choose a method of isolation for fish. Depending on what I need to isolate, the method may be different each time the need arises. I may have an adult peacock that needs solitary confinement, I may have fry that are too small to go in with other fish but too mature for a tumbler, I may have a female that is about to either spit her young or give birth.

I have used the clear breeder boxes many times, and that's usually my go-to item. I have several small and a large to choose from. I also have a couple breeder nets that I could choose from.

But I have a female Pineapple Lyretail Sword that is gravid and have left her alone for the first few weeks.

Not wanting to lose any fry as snacks to any tankmates, I put her in a breeder box. Ya'll, this fish went NUTS! I thought she was going to knock herself out. I tried turning lights out, but I have live plants, so that isn't an option for long. I tried putting construction paper on the outside to block her view of me. Nope. I think she felt the floor move.

I tried the net. Same deal, just softer blows. I tried a larger home made basket, and she jumped out.


So I went to the dollar store and found a very light weight basket with small holes. But not small enough. I also bought some pantyhose. I put the basket inside the hose and it fit perfectly. So I tied the legs together around the bottom of the basket. Next, I cut off and excess material. The tightness off the waist closed off much of the top, so I didn't have to work very hard to close it, preventing an escape.

It also is dark enough(tan) that she doesn't seem to notice me. She is calm!!

I hope any day now to have fry from her, and another success story in the life a fish breeder.

DESCRIPTION

Melanotaenia picta is a new rainbowfish from the Aru Islands in Indonesia. I purchased eggs when Gary Lange recently came and talked to GVAC. It was described in 2015, and before that was known as "Mel. goldei ARU 2". It is a very attractive fish, and the word "picta" in latin means "beautiful" or "colorful". The body has much deep and reflective blue with a broad black horizontal band going from the nose into the

tail. A yellow background and orange or red in the fins and tail add to its' appeal. Its' natural habitat has very clear, clean water with a limestone base and minimal plants, but numerous logs and wood. The environment is pristine with small rainforest brooks, indicating that frequent water changes are helpful. The Painted Rainbow is a fast-growing fish that can reach 5 inches, so a decent sized tank is necessary. They eat most all foods and are very active. Females are usually a little smaller, have shorter fins, and less color

BREEDING

They lay eggs in nylon mops, although they didn't seem quite as prolific as some rainbowfish. I prefer to pick the eggs and hatch them separately in water treated with methylene blue and light aeration. At 80 degrees, the eggs hatch in 7 days and the fry need tiny foods like Golden Pearls (5-50 microns) to start. The young begin to color up at 6 weeks of age and can be fully colored at 16 weeks.
